

CJIS COMPLIANCE SERVICES



The Criminal Justice Information Services (CJIS) Division of the US Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) gives state, local, and federal law enforcement and criminal justice agencies access to criminal justice information (CJI)—for example, fingerprint records and criminal histories.

All private contractors and law enforcement organizations who process CJI must sign the CJIS Security Addendum, a uniform agreement approved by the US Attorney General that helps ensure the security and confidentiality of CJI required by the Security Policy. It also commits the contractor to maintaining a security program consistent with federal and state laws, regulations, and standards, and limits the use of CJI to the purposes for which a government agency provided it.

What are the CJIS compliance requirements?

Unlike many of the compliance frameworks, there is no central CJIS authorization body, no accredited pool of independent assessors, nor a standardized assessment approach to determining whether a particular solution is considered "CJIS compliant". Simply put, a standardized "CJIS compliant" solution which works across *all* law enforcement agencies does not exist.
